Students who participate in the Student Apprenticeship Program will have the opportunity to gain hands-on experience and to personally learn from an established entrepreneur and mentor. The program is available during the Fall, Spring, and Summer semesters.

Host organizations donate to The iMADdu Fund to support entrepreneurship education and receive 10-12 weeks of project assistance from a bright and passionate student who is interested in learning and impacting a local organization.
